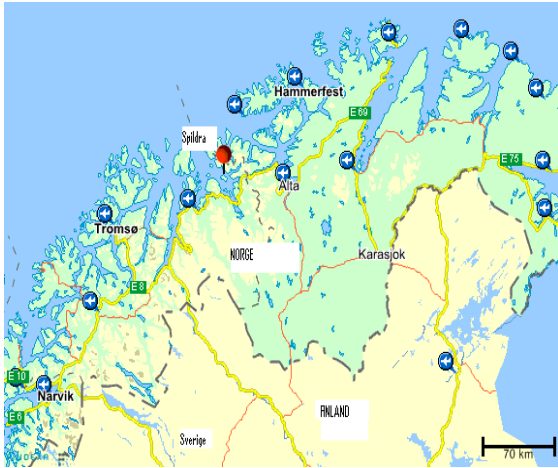


How to get to Spildra



Express boats call daily at Spildra from Burfjord or Skjervøy.

FISHING AND LEISURE ACTIVITIES

NORTHERN NORWAY



Spildra is a mountainous island in Kvænangen Municipality in Troms County in Northern Norway and is situated in the centre of Kvænangen's expansive outer region. The island covers an area of 21.4 km² and its highest point is 444 metres above sea level. From the summit, there is a spectacular 360° view of the fiord and open sea to the north, Reinfjord and Jøkelfjord to the east, Inner Kvænangen to the south and the Kvæangstindene peaks to the west. There are marked hiking trails and, during the winter months, prepared cross-country skiing tracks.

The settlement of Dunvik on the southern point of the island has a population of 40. Facilities here include a wharf, fish processing plant, general store, postal services, school and an outlet selling local crafts. Express boats call here daily from Skjervøy and Burfjord.



During spring and summer, the island has a rich birdlife. The dominant species are seagulls, geese, sea swallows, cormorants and ducks. However, you

may also spot razor bills, guillernots, white-billed divers, curlew species, common snipes, sea dotterels and birds of prey like sea eagles, buzzards and falcons.

The island also has several easily accessible fishing grounds and it's also possible to fish from the bare rock-face. Boats are also available for hire.



Spildra has a rich cultural heritage. Tromsø Museum has several excavations and registrations on the island. The result of this work is presented in a leaflet titled "Spildra- med fortida inn i framtida" (Spildra – a future encompassing the past). A cultural heritage trail has been established to view the finds. Five of the 30 bear graves discovered in Norway are situated on Spildra.

Accommodation

A cabin sleeping up to six people featuring lounge, kitchen, bathroom, sauna and cable TV

Activities:

Fishing trips in one of our boats:

- 16.5 foot boat with 9.9 hp motor (5 people)
- 14.5 foot boat with 30 hp motor (4 people)
- Guided tour by boat to the islands of Loppa and Skorpa, the Øksfjordjøkulen Glacier and the Kvæangstindene peaks
- Guided tours to archaeological excavations (from May to September)
